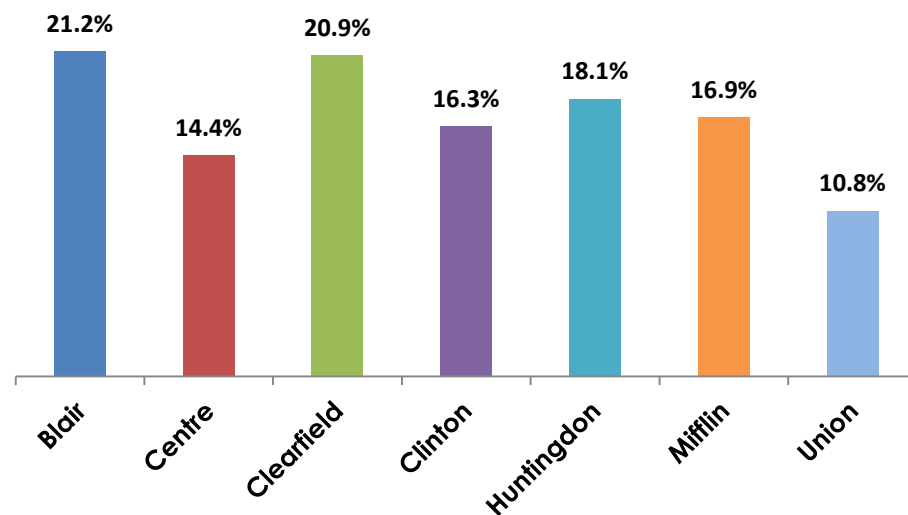


The Counties of Blair, Centre, Clearfield, Clinton, Huntingdon, Mifflin and Union

The presence of children is often determines if both parents in married-couple families participate in the labor force. The table below details the **percent of families, with and without children, in which both adults are in the labor force.**

With both the husband and wife working, what is the **difference in the percent of between working couples with no children and couples with children?**



Percent of married-couples in which husband is in labor force and wife is not in labor force, with and without children

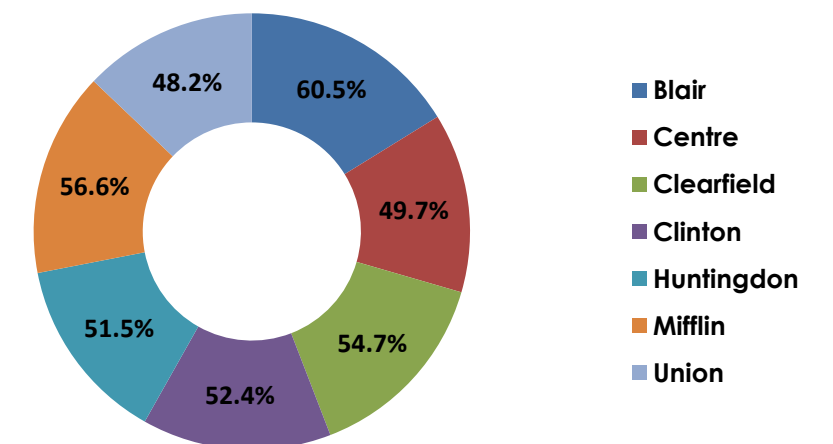
Percent of married-couple families in which wife is in labor force and husband is not in labor force, with and without children

County	No Children	Children
Blair	8.7%	3.0%
Centre	6.2%	2.8%
Clearfield	8.5%	5.3%
Clinton	6.8%	4.0%
Huntingdon	4.9%	5.9%
Mifflin	7.7%	2.7%
Union	7.5%	5.0%

For married-couples, with or without children, if only one spouse is employed it typically is the husband. Again, the presence of children reflects on these percentages.

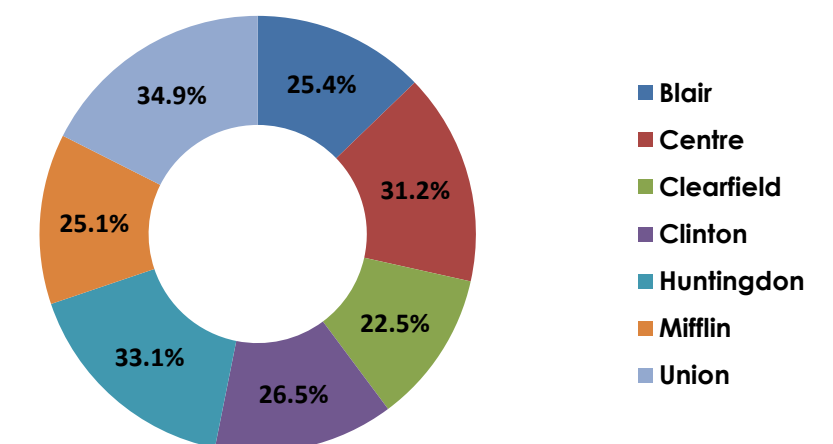
Single mothers in the labor force

Work Status for Married-Couple Families with Children

Householder and Spouse work status in the past 12 months

Full-time employment in the past 12 months for the householder is encouraging across most counties. At least two-thirds of married couple families had the householder working full-time and that percent is nearly three-quarters for householders in Centre County.

Full-time employment for spouses in the past 12 months was fairly comparable across all counties with at least one-third of spouses in married couple families having worked full-time.

Percentages for part-time employment are lower for both householders and spouses in each county yet fairly comparable. Part-time employment for both householders and spouses was slightly higher in Huntingdon County.

This is based on the responses of the householder and the spouse separately. We cannot assume that full-time employed householders have full-time employed spouses nor do part-time employed householders have part-time employed spouses.
