NUMBER 14 OF 2021

WHEREAS, in Centre County there are 71 children and youth in foster care being provided with a safe, secure, and stable home, who have been placed with a compassionate and nurturing foster family through Centre County Children and Youth Services; and

WHEREAS, there are over 60 foster families who have opened their homes and hearts to children whose families are in crisis and who play a vital role in helping children and families heal, reconnect, find permanency, and who also help launch these children into successful adulthood; and

WHEREAS, there is an on-going need for more foster homes in Centre County; and

WHEREAS, the passage of the Adoption and Safe Families Act increases the need for foster homes that provide respite, on-going placement, and kinship/foster/adoptive settings for children and youth; and


WHEREAS, the community needs to be made aware of the needs of children, as well as the enduring commitment and contribution of foster parents.






